On Wednesday, October 11 and Thursday October 12, there will be a Pangolin User Meeting held in Amsterdam, Holland, which will likely be the biggest Pangolin User Meeting ever!!

For the location of the meeting, we have chosen the Discotheque "Hemkade48" in Zaandam (www.hemkade.nl), which is very close to downtown Amsterdam. This is and also close to the Shiphol International Airport, as well as a lot of tourist attractions. Because of the bigger setup, this year's meeting will be divided into two long days.

On Wednesday, October 11, the meeting will have all ingredients as in past meetings, but also have some extras. For example, we will have several computers setup around the room so that you can play with almost all known Pangolin programs and plug-ins. There will be a staff of professionals at your disposal, ready to answer all your questions and show you the products in detail. (You can also follow an in-depth workshop the next day if you are interested.)

As usual, we will have a presentation of new and existing products from Pangolin and Pangolin dealers, a T-shirt giveaway, Pangolin Prize competition, and free Update-CDs. Besides all this, we will have a Pangolin-style LASE-OFF after a tasty diner, where Pangolin users can show of their work, as well as shows that are just interesting or funny to watch. We will a very impressive set-up with multiple RGB lasers and even the Jenoptik RGB laser. (As you can see we will do everything that we can to make this a meeting that you won't forget.)

After all this excitement you can pull up a chair and relax in our "laser-bar" were you can discuss the future of the laser business and coming attractions in laser world. Undoubtedly there will be some roundtable discussions with interesting topics. There will be a variety of computers available so that you can actively learn by doing, and also ask questions about your own past shows, since the software and hardware will be right in front of you. Again, we will have a professional staff available, as well as a few power-users to teach you tricks to work faster and better.

For this special occasion, Master Laserists Glenn Turner and Hugo Bunk will especially highlight LivePRO, because many users have told us they understand the basics, but still have only scratched the surface. You will be taught how to create your own LivePRO workspace as well as some new things that LivePRO can do for you.

After all of this serious work and after a nice dinner, there will be a sort of LivePRO LASE-OFF were you can show us what you have learned. Every LivePRO- and Live-Jockey will have about 10-20 minutes to show his or her skills. We will collectively decide who the winner is, and then the winner will be the LivePRO Master for 2006.

All along, the "laser-bar" will be open until very late so that you can continue to have conversations with other laserists. And if the weather is with us, we can show our foreign laser friends the ins and outs of Amsterdam.
